### Trustees Officially Appointed

When the cemetery was deeded to the people of Milwaukie in 1869, it was to be handled by trustees. Trustees were to appoint new trustees as folks passed or moved away. This practice was continued until the 1980's (over 100 years!) when the last living trustees turned the cemetery over to the city to provide maintenance. The city included the Pioneer Cemetery as part of an intergovernmental agreement with North Clackamas Parks District in the early 1990's. There were no living trustees when our association began in 2003.

The Oregon Circuit Court, as petitioned on behalf of our Cemetery Assoc. by the City of Milwaukie, officially appointed Madalaine Bohl, Dolly Macken-Hambright and Mark Neubauer as Milwaukie Pioneer Cemetery Trustees. At the May 1 Board meeting an additional trustee was added, Jim Wiley, Sr., bringing the number of trustees to four.

Trustees are automatically included as Board members and will continue to appoint up to five trustees as time moves forward, getting the intent of the founders back on track.

### Museum Open House...

May 14, Milwaukie Museum held the annual open house. The event was attended by many folks, both at the museum and at the cemetery. Association members were on hand at the cemetery to answer questions and provide information. (See related article on back page.)

As part of this year's work, the Historical Society produced a book about the cemetery, **Milwaukie Pioneer Cemetery Comes to Life**, which is still available at Milwaukie Museum for \$10. Included in the book are some histories of the families interred at our cemetery, and it is very interesting reading.

## Memorial Day, 2004—

May 22nd saw 23 volunteers, tools in hand, who pitched in and mowed, weed-whacked, raked and trimmed to set the cemetery to rights for Memorial Day. Volunteers and donors brought hot-dogs, soda, and so forth for the hungry workers at noon break (see photo below R.). All this to prepare for the first Association's Memorial Day about a week away...

Memorial Day dawned cloudy and overcast, which did not stop Boy Scout Troop #143 (below L) from raising the flag at 8AM. There was no rain the entire day as visitors placed flowers on loved one's graves and walked mowed lawn, enjoying the grounds. We had 48 people who signed the guest book and we received some generous donations, and a few new members signed on.



### **Milwaukie Pioneer Cemetery Association Receives Grant...**

The Association has been awarded a grant through the Oregon Commission on Historical Cemeteries, a part of the State Parks Board, to use to purchase hoses and sprinklers for use at the cemetery during the dry summer months. The amount, \$150.00, will provide watering means and repairs to the storage vault door for securing maintenance items.

Though we have not received these funds to date, we assume they will be forthcoming in the very near future.

### **OHCA and the Audubon Society visit Milwaukie Pioneer...**

On April 24th, representatives of the Oregon Historical Cemetery Association and the local Audubon Society visited Milwaukie Pioneer Cemetery as part of a tour of various pioneer cemeteries titled the Headstone and Habitat Tour. The bird count event was held in five Metro area cemeteries, Columbian, Lone Fir, Riverview, Milwaukie and Greenwood Hills.
