Obelisk, shared for #1 & #4—

N side: the body D.G.A. Venville was found 12 miles from Baler and was laid to rest here Dec 15, 1901

E side, center: in circle w/rf. anchor & In loving remembrance of **D. G. A. Venville** born **Jan 8, 1881** who was wounded and captured with Lieut. Gilmore of the U.S. Navy on Apr 12, 1899, at Baler, Luzon, P.I. and was treacherously murdered, by order of Novicio, an insurgent Genl. some time after Feb. 20, 1900. We know not where his body lies but his spirit is with God.

E side, @ base: What though in lonely grief I sigh for friends no longer nigh. Submissive still would I reply, Thy will be done.

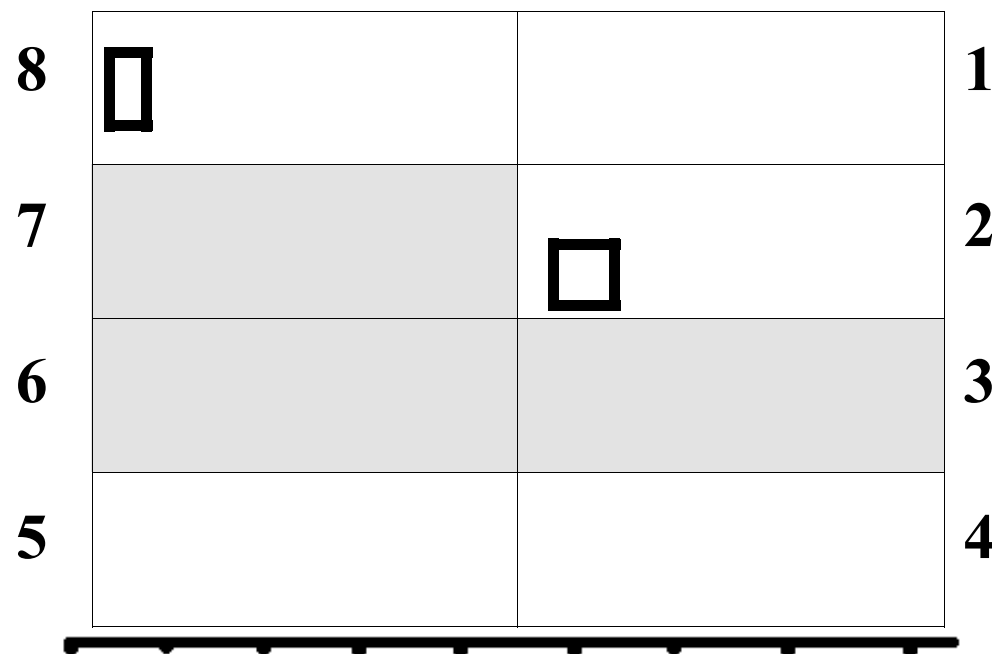
S side: **Harry Mash** died **Mar 24, 1902**
